Superintendent Doug Carter was born and raised in Laporte, Indiana. After graduating from LaPorte High School in 1980, he went on to attend Ball State University and was later accepted into the 42<sup>nd</sup> Indiana State Police Recruit School in July 1984. He holds a Bachelor of Science Degree with an emphasis on Management, Leadership and Organizational Structure from Indiana Wesleyan University.

Superintendent Carter served eighteen years with the Indiana State Police from November 1984 until December 2002 and was assigned to the Pendleton State Police District while serving Hamilton County. In 2002, Superintendent Carter sought the elected office of Sheriff of Hamilton County and ultimately served two terms from January 2003 through December 2010 as the elected Sheriff.

Appointed by Governor Mike Pence, Superintendent Carter became Indiana's twentieth Superintendent of the State Police on January 14, 2013, and was reappointed by Governor Eric Holcomb on January 13, 2017.

Superintendent Carter resides in Hamilton County with his family.
